The Executive Committee consists of individuals elected by the General Assembly and serves as the governance board of the society.


The Secretariat

Climate justice & Just Transition

Brighters tackles climate injustice and enhances community resilience by actively involving young people and diverse stakeholders across local, national, and global platforms. Our interventions adopt an integrated approach, combining climate awareness, advocacy efforts, and grassroots solutions. In 2023, key areas of focus included improving climate literacy, amplifying youth perspectives in climate decision-making processes, and championing climate justice principles in policy reforms. Through our wide-ranging initiatives, we engaged and empowered more than 15,000 young individuals and community members, driving positive change towards a more resilient and equitable future.

Highlights



Bangladesh Youth Climate Parliament - BYCP

The Bangladesh Youth Climate Parliament, inaugurated in August 2023, marks a significant step in addressing climate challenges. With 170 young participants from diverse backgrounds, the initiative focuses on renewable energy and local climate issues.

It aims to elect 10,000 "Youth MPs" across 300 constituencies, promoting youth engagement, capacity building, and policy advocacy. The program addresses constituency-specific climate vulnerabilities and fosters collaboration for grassroots climate resilience solutions, empowering youth to drive sustainable development practices and enhance community resilience.

Global Climate Strike

The Global Climate Strike, initiated in 2018 and inspired by Greta Thunberg, has evolved into a worldwide youth-led movement demanding urgent climate action.



Global climate Strike is mobilizing millions globally, advocating for climate justice and renewable energy transition, and influencing policy discussions. In Bangladesh, Brighters Society has been instrumental, mobilizing over 28,000 youth since 2019, conducting strikes across 64 districts, and adapting to online activism during the pandemic. The movement has increased public awareness, pushed for corporate sustainability, and demonstrated the power of youth in shaping environmental policies and driving change.


Bangladesh Youth Climate Parliament - BYCP



The Bangladesh Youth Climate Parliament (BYCP), a flagship initiative by Brighters Society of Bangladesh, Change Initiative, and Save the Children Bangladesh, marks a groundbreaking stride in addressing the nation's climate challenges, particularly in the realm of renewable energy. Inaugurated on 29 August,2023 this first-ever climate-based parliament led by Bangladeshi youth witnessed the presence of 170 young individuals from diverse constituencies, who raised concerns about local climate issues, proposed eco-friendly solutions, and shared their aspirations for the BYCP. Honorable Minister of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, Saber H Chowdhury, graced the occasion, expressing excitement over the program's potential to elect 10,000 registered "Youth MPs" across 300 constituencies to champion climate change, sustainability, and environmental causes.



Through a structured platform, the BYCP empowers youth engagement, capacity building, and solution-driven action, fostering collaboration among diverse backgrounds to tackle environmental challenges, raise climate awareness, and engage policymakers. With a focus on constituency-specific climate vulnerabilities, the program aims to promote environmental education, advocate for policy reforms, and foster sustainable development practices, ultimately enhancing community resilience and driving tangible solutions for climate resilience at the grassroots level.



Story of BYCP

"The voices or demands that we youths make from the grassroots level are often not addressed to the policymakers at the national level. However, the Bangladesh Youth Climate Parliament provides a platform where youth can raise their voices directly to policymakers on climate change issues in their area and work together to find sustainable solutions to climate issues in their communities."



Asaduzzaman Tohin is a dedicated Climate activist from Bangladesh. He has been involved in the Climate Justice movement from 2021. He is the regional coordinator of Dhaka-Mymensingh region in Brighters Society of Bangladesh. Tohin is One of the Youth M.P Of Bangladesh Youth Climate Parliament. He belongs from Dinajpur-6 constituency which is one of the drought prone areas of Bangladesh. With a focus on constituency-specific climate vulnerabilities, the BYCP program aims to promote environmental education, advocate for policy reforms, and foster sustainable development practices, ultimately enhancing community resilience and driving tangible solutions for climate resilience at the grassroots level. Representing his constituency, he championed the plight of farmers grappling with prolonged dry spells. With unwavering determination, Tohin advocated for alternative livelihoods, drought-tolerant crops, community seed banks, and rainwater harvesting measures. His grassroots efforts resonated, amplifying the call for clean water access and climate-resilient solutions. Through the BYCP's structured platform, Tohin empowered youth engagement, fostered collaboration, and drove policy reforms, positioning environmental education and sustainable development practices as the cornerstones of a resilient future.



Education: Focused on Climate, Environment & Just Transition

Brighters prioritized climate education and capacity building through innovative projects like Climate Times (Bangladesh's first Bengali climate website), thought-provoking climate comic books, eco-tourism experiences, and the Bangladesh Youth Climate School (BYCS). These initiatives aimed to raise awareness, nurture environmental stewardship, and empower youth as agents of change, equipping them with knowledge and skills to tackle climate and environmental challenges while championing justice and equity.

Climate Times

Climate Times was Bangladesh's pioneering Bengali climate website launched by Brighters.

It served as a valuable knowledge hub, providing up-to-date news, resources, and insights on climate change, environmental issues, and sustainable practices in the local language. By making climate information accessible to the masses, Climate Times empowered communities to understand and respond to climate challenges effectively.

Comic Book

Brighters developed engaging and educational comic books to raise climate awareness among youth and general audiences.



These comic books used storytelling and visuals to simplify complex climate concepts, making them relatable and easy to understand. Through captivating narratives, the comic books encouraged readers to reflect on their environmental impact and adopt eco-friendly habits.

Climate Comics




The Brighters Society of Bangladesh, in collaboration with ActionAid Bangladesh, has pioneered a groundbreaking "Climate Comics" initiative to promote climate education and awareness through Bangladesh's first-ever Bengali comic book focused on climate change. Recognizing the need for an accessible and engaging platform, Climate Comics aims to educate people of all ages about the basics of climate change, its impacts, and the importance of taking action towards a sustainable future. The comic book series features three main stories: "Battery Birombona," covering climate change causes, disasters, health effects from pollutants, and youth activism; "Sufi Pagal's Jungle," highlighting the importance of trees and forests, and protests against deforestation; and "Koyla Kelenkari," exploring the harmful effects of fossil fuels, environmental disasters from coal-based power plants, and collective awareness to protect life and nature.



By leveraging visual storytelling and relatable narratives. Climate Comics makes complex climate information more understandable and engaging, especially for those who find the subject matter uninteresting or difficult. Since its launch in December 2022, the initiative has reached over 10,000 youths and children through online and offline platforms, with printed copies distributed to youth hubs and "climate cafes" in 25 schools, allowing students to learn about climate impacts on their lives. With over 5,000 direct beneficiaries in its first edition and the potential to reach hundreds of thousands more through its online presence, Climate Comics aims to foster a deeper understanding of climate change and inspire people to take action towards building a sustainable future.





Climate Times



Brighters Society of Bangladesh has launched 'Climate Times', a climate-oriented website in Bengali language, to promote climate education among the youth, especially in remote areas, under the 'Youth Engagement in Democracy' project. The website aims to bridge the knowledge gap surrounding climate change by providing informative articles on various climate-related topics like causes, mitigation processes, human rights, migration, advocacy, policies, impacts on agriculture, ecosystems, public health, and food security. With over 50 articles uploaded so far and more in the pipeline, reaching 5,018 people and directly benefiting 6,058 individuals, Climate Times serves as a knowledge powerhouse in native language for young people, professionals, and enthusiasts, facilitating learning, research, and analysis on climate change.



Catering to rural youth with limited access to capacity-building workshops, the website's focus on informative Bengali content contributes to raising climate awareness, fostering a climate-conscious mindset, and empowering the youth to take action towards a more sustainable future.

The Bangladesh Youth Climate School (BYCS) was established by Brighters to build capacity and empower young climate leaders. Empowered by this comprehensive approach to climate education, Sayem became a well-informed and passionate child advocate, striving to bridge knowledge gaps, reach remote areas, and inspire widespread awareness and action towards a sustainable future.



Youth Mobilization

Friend Raiser Debate on Climate Change & Human Rights



Recognizing the interconnectedness of climate change and human rights, Brighters organized Friend Raiser Debates that encouraged critical thinking and discourse among youth on the social and ethical dimensions of the climate crisis. Bangladesh Youth COP 2023



The Bangladesh Youth CoP 2023, organized by Brighters Society of Bangladesh & ActionAid Bangladesh, was a flagship event aimed at amplifying the voices of climate-conscious youth and marginalized communities in the country. The primary objective was to develop a Green Manifesto emphasizing renewable energy adoption ahead of the 2024 national elections. Under the theme "Make noise, Raise voice for green Manifesto," the event highlighted the crucial role of renewable energy in mitigating climate change, reducing carbon emissions, ensuring energy security, creating employment opportunities, and promoting sustainable development. It provided a platform for Bangladeshi youth to express their demands, gain advocacy skills, and influence policy decisions related to a just energy transition. Through a grand opening, workshops, consultations, and sessions across various regions, the event covered topics such as coastal vulnerabilities, women's empowerment, climate impacts on agriculture, urban resilience, and energy transition.



Approximately 1,000 youth participants from different parts of Bangladesh contributed their perspectives and recommendations for the comprehensive Green Manifesto. The event emphasized the urgency of transitioning to renewable energy sources, addressing the impacts of fossil fuel usage, and ensuring climate justice and sustainable development. resulting Green Manifesto, reflecting the youth's aspirations and demands, was distributed to political parties before the elections, aiming to influence their election manifestos and shape a sustainable energy future for Bangladesh. Overall, the Bangladesh Youth CoP 2023 established successfully a platform Bangladeshi youth to actively participate in policy discussions, advocate for renewable energy adoption, and drive meaningful change in national energy policies.

Driven by a deep commitment to empowering the youth, Taslima has played a pivotal role in the creation of the Green Manifesto, a powerful document that encapsulates the demands of Bangladesh's grassroots youth. This manifesto, rooted in environmental conservation, climate change mitigation, and social issues, has the potential to shape government policies and foster positive transformations in education, health, and societal norms.



Environmental Right, Sustainability & Resilience

Community Event on Eco-system Restoration

We hosted community events to raise environmental awareness and resilience, engaging local residents in activities designed to promote sustainable living and environmental stewardship.

My Planet My Responsibility Campaign to End Plastic Pollution



This campaign successfully promoted eco-friendly practices and responsible waste management, encouraging thousands of households to adopt sustainable habits and reduce their environmental footprint.



Climate Awareness Campaign

This climate change awareness campaign educated the public on impacts and solutions, encouraging sustainable lifestyles and support for climate action through outreach, events, and multimedia content.

Highlights



Study on "Assessing Clean Water Accessibility And Rate Of Water-borne Disease in the Kallayanpur Slum Area"

We conducted an in-depth study to evaluate clean water accessibility and the prevalence of water-borne diseases in the Kallayanpur slum area. The findings from this research have been instrumental in advocating for improved water quality and access, directly influencing policies to ensure the right to clean water for this vulnerable community.

Townhall Meeting: Right to Clean Water, Advocacy to Access



This advocacy program aimed to ensure access to safe and clean water for community members. Through a townhall meeting format, it raised awareness about the fundamental human right to clean water and advocated for improved water quality and accessibility, especially in underserved areas. The program empowered community members to voice their concerns, learn about water-related issues, and collectively push for policy changes and resources to address water contamination and inadequate water supply affecting their communities.

Special Feature

Study on "Assessing Clean Water Accessibility And Rate Of Water-borne Disease in the Kallayanpur Slum Area"



The study conducted by Brighters Society of Bangladesh in a collaboration with Manusher Jonno Foundation and Global Research & Marketing aimed to assess the access to clean water and prevalence of waterborne diseases among the slum dwellers of Kallyanpur, Dhaka. This research empowers people in the community and brings out the voice of the grassroots. Data was collected from 299 sample households, focus group discussions, in-depth interviews, and a case study. The findings unveiled a distressing reality. Despite most households depending on WASA tubewells for drinking water, the supply was severely limited to merely 1-2 hours per day, and the water quality was compromised due to contaminants. Compounding the issue, the monthly water bills, ranging from 301 to 500 taka, imposed a substantial financial burden on families with low incomes. Alarmingly, a staggering 39% of reported disease cases were attributed to contaminated water sources this year alone. The sanitation situation painted an equally concerning picture.





Only 34% of residents had access to hygienic, functional toilet facilities, with some toilets being shared by up to 15 families at once. The lack of running water in toilets perpetuated the problem of open defecation. Handwashing facilities and water treatment systems were woefully scarce, despite 33% of residents receiving hygiene training from NGOs. The study highlighted the urgent need for increased funding and improved policies to address this water and sanitation crisis. Recommendations included installing water booths and more taps, constructing additional communal toilets with separate facilities for men and women, promoting capacity building on sanitation and water management, improving pipeline quality and waste management, and fostering collaboration between the government, NGOs, and communities to expand interventions. Ensuring access to clean water and proper sanitation is a fundamental human right, and addressing these issues through multisectoral approaches is crucial for protecting the well-being and rights of the Kalyanpur slum residents.

Special Feature

Right to Clean Water, Advocacy to Access



Brighters, in collaboration with MANUSHER JONNO FOUNDATION, conducted a social study to assess the availability of clean water and the rate of water-borne diseases in the Kalyanpur new market slum area. The research revealed that clean water was scarce, and the people were suffering from various water-borne diseases due to consuming polluted water. Based on the findings, Brighters' research team recommended installing more water booths and taps, constructing communal toilets with separate facilities for men and women, promoting capacity building on sanitation and water management, improving pipeline quality, and discarding contamination. To share the research results and advocate for change, Brighters organized an event titled "Securing Rights: Clean Water Access and Disease Prevention in Kallyanpur Slum" on March 10 at Bangladesh Film Archive, Agargaon, where a Town Hall Meeting "Right to Water, Advocacy to Access" was conducted. The event brought together community members, politicians, researchers, volunteers, development workers, and stakeholders.





After sharing the research summary and a documentary, guest speakers Asif Chowdhury and Zakia Haque, research specialists, provided suggestions. Farzana Sultana from Manusher Jonno Foundation pledged support for program implementation. Notably, about 15 community members participated, voicing their opinions on their right to clean water and demanding more water booths. The counselor assured cooperation and initiatives to ensure clean water access. Following the town hall, Brighters facilitated meetings with community leaders, stakeholders like "Bumijo", and consultations with community members, culminating in the formation of a "Fresh Water Rights Forum" led by the community to work towards establishing their rights to fresh water. From identifying the problem to creating a "Fresh Water Right Forum" through research recommendations to establish fresh water rights for the community people, this is the result of Brighters' advocacy program for building a sustainable and climateresilient future for all.

Evidence Based Advocacy Story

Her partnership with Brighters proved instrumental in their quest for clean water. Through Barefoot Research, Brighters identified unsafe water sources and alarming rates of waterborne diseases in the slums. Empowered with this data, Asma rallied the community, leading to town hall demands for more water points. Brighters facilitated consultations with councilors and residents, culminating in the formation of the Right to Clean Water Forum. Asma's unwavering leadership, coupled with Brighters' continuous advocacy, amplified the community's voice. Their relentless efforts paid off, securing improved access to safe water and establishing a precedent for marginalized communities to claim their rights. This powerful collaboration exemplifies Brighters' commitment to climate justice, uplifting grassroots leaders like Asma and catalyzing transformation from the ground up.

Impactful Initiatives

Abandoned water treatment plant is reopening to provide clean water to the people of Kalyanpur slum!



Brighters Society of Bangladesh, in collaboration with Manusher Jonno Foundation and Global Research & Marketing, conducted a comprehensive study to assess the accessibility of clean water and the prevalence of water-borne diseases in the Kalyanpur slum area of Dhaka. The findings were alarming, revealing a severe lack of access to clean water, with WASA tubewells providing contaminated water for only 1-2 hours per day, and a staggering 39% of reported disease cases being attributed to contaminated water sources. The sanitation situation was equally concerning, with only 34% of residents having access to hygienic toilet facilities and open defecation being a common practice. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, Brighters organized an event titled "Securing Rights: Clean Water Access and Disease Prevention in Kallyanpur Slum," where they shared the research findings and facilitated a Town Hall Meeting, "Right to Water, Advocacy to Access." This event brought together community members, stakeholders, researchers, and policymakers, providing a platform for the community to voice their demands for clean water access and more water booths.

Following the town hall, Brighters facilitated meetings with community leaders, stakeholders like "Bhumijo," and consultations with community members. After that 1 feedback meeting was held on this issue. Brighters' advocacy efforts led to the formation of a "Fresh Water Rights Forum" led by the community, dedicated to working towards establishing their rights to fresh water. This initiative not only highlighted the critical issue of water scarcity and poor sanitation but also empowered the community to take action and advocate for their basic human rights, demonstrating Brighters' commitment to building a sustainable and climate-resilient future for all. Brighters Impactful initiative to pave the way for solving community problems by setting up Right to Fresh Water Forums to address their access to clean water issues through advocacy with community leaders, starting from a training session with its recommendations and engaging with stakeholders at the field level.
